We understand that a diagnosis of childhood, adolescent or young adult cancer has a devastating impact on the entire family. We help to ease the burden of diagnosis and treatment by raising funds to provide practical and emotional supports for families and survivors.

How Fundraising Helps

Childhood Cancer Ireland does not receive any Government funding. We are funded through the generosity of community and corporate donations.

Some of our current projects:

- Nationwide workshops for parents to help them process the experience of childhood cancer.
- Financial workshops for parents to help them recover from the financial strain of childhood cancer - research has shown an average cost of €15,000 per annum.
- We brought the Beads of Courage® Haematology/Oncology Programme to Ireland and continue to fund it.
- We refurbish Paediatric Oncology isolation rooms / treatment rooms in 16 shared care hospitals around the country.

About Childhood Cancer Awareness Month and Light It Up Gold

In September, the Light It Up Gold campaign helps shine a light on the challenges that children and families living with childhood, adolescent and young adult cancer face during treatment and into survivorship.

As more children, adolescents and young adults are being diagnosed with childhood cancer every year, demands for supports for children, young people and their families are increasing.

Thankfully, the 5-year survival rate is also on the rise but survivors may live with the long-term and late effects of their treatment well into adulthood.

How can your club support Childhood Cancer Ireland this September?

Our main event is our Light It Up Gold Childhood Cancer Awareness Walks, which we will outline further below.


We also attempt to light prominent buildings gold at some point during the month.

This helps to increase visibility of childhood cancer in the community and creates photos which can be used on social media to spread the word further.

If there is a public or prominent building in your area that you could approach to Light It Up Told this September, we have provided a letter with all of the relevant details which you can use to contact them.

Some other event ideas are:

- Awareness stand in local shopping centre/shop to sell gold ribbon pins
- Tractor run / vintage car show or rally

Light It Up Gold Walk Event

One of the most important aspects of the Light It Up Gold awareness campaign is to make visible the reality of living with and beyond childhood cancer. The campaign offers solidarity to families, creates greater awareness and understanding of what it means to live with childhood cancer and to be a survivor, as well as spreading vital knowledge on the signs and symptoms to look out for in our children, adolescents and young adults.

The Light It Up Gold walks bring the community together in solidarity with families living with childhood cancer and to honour all children in the community who have been taken too soon by this terrible disease.

Suggested distance

You can choose the distance but usually the walk is around 3km.

Suggested venue

You may decide to use a sports venue with a hall and to loop the pitch for your walk. You could also choose a local park or route in the town.

Who will attend

This event will appeal to the club's audience, local community, families affected by childhood cancer in the area and other community groups.

How to promote

Childhood Cancer Ireland will list all walks on our website to inform families and we will promote on our social media and other channels. Your club can also promote the even via your own social media and on local press and radio.

<u>Fundraising</u>

Light It Up Gold is primarily an awareness event and, although there is no onus on clubs to fundraise, all donations to the charity are appreciated. You may like to incorporate a fundraising element to your event and we will make every effort to keep any funds raised in your community, through our shared care projects, workshops and other regional work. Any funds raised in Northern Ireland will be used to extend parent peer support to NI in late 2023 / early 2024.

Our flagship Light It Up Gold Walk

Childhood Cancer Ireland will hold a flagship Light It Up Gold Walk in Maynooth, Co. Kildare for the first time since 2016 and would welcome any involvement from clubs who may like to support.

Light It Up Gold Walk Event Outline:

5.30pm	Event starts with registration and networking, and a few fun activities for children
6.30pm	A short Candlelight walk starts
7.15pm	A speaker of your choice addresses the gathering
7.30pm	Local choir to perform
8.30pm	Event ends
